# Carl von Ossietzky

- 1889-1938
- Journalist, author, pacifist, democrat
- Nobel Peace Prize for 1935 (awarded in 1936)
- Exposed Germany's secret rearmament program after WW1.
- Persecuted, imprisoned by the Nazis
- Suffered torture in concentration camp
- Died in 1938 as a direct consequence of the mistreatment.
- University was named after him in 1991.

# The Master's program "Social Sciences"




- Strong social science foundation with equal emphasis on sociology and political science



# Competence goals of sow941 Politics and Organisations (9 KP)









How do politicians behave in parliament







✓ deepen theoretical and analytical knowledge on the processes of knowledge production in modern society in general





✓ gain insights in specific processes of the production and the distribution of political knowledge and competencies to learners in certain organisations and other learning environments





# Competence goals of sow943 Society and Organisations (9 KP)



✓ give students a solid understanding of **labor markets** and social inequality research, and provide the skills to conduct own empirical research projects:





- ✓ understand the central concepts and theories in the field,
- ✓ distinguish, explain, and evaluate various dimensions and causes of inequalities,
- ✓ understand data sources and research methods used in realworld studies,
- ✓ compare and evaluate findings from research articles,
- ✓ develop and answer your own research question using theory and secondary data analysis in a written seminar paper.



# Competence goals of sow944 Quantitative Research Methods (6 KP)



- ✓ Working knowledge of common basic and advanced statistical methods
  - ✓ Data management
  - ✓ Descriptive data analysis & visualization
  - ✓ Linear & generalized linear regression
  - ✓ Multilevel regression (e.g. for longitudinal data)
  - ✓ Approaches to causal inference
- ✓ Critical understanding of quantitative empirical studies, including their limitations
- ✓ Ability to conduct data analytics tasks using the statistical software R/RStudio





# Competence goals of sow948 Qualitative Research Methods (6 KP)



- ✓ Working knowledge of advanced methods of qualitative social research
  - ✓ Data collection methods (ethnography, interviews, focus groups)
  - ✓ Data analysis/interpretation
  - ✓ Mixed methods designs
  - ✓ QDA software
- ✓ Ability to decide when to use quant/qual methods
- ✓ Ability to critically assess existing research
  along established quality criteria
- ✓ Experience with conducting & documenting own qualitative research

# **Practice modules – Project and Internship (24 CP)**



#### sow971 Project

(introductory session in the 1st semester) (3 CP in the 2nd semester) (9 CP in the 3rd semester)

As part of an independent research project, students will learn to ...

- formulate their own empirically workable research question
- develop an appropriate theoretical framework
- conduct and evaluate their own empirical study

The objectives are to ...

- foster the practical application of acquired theoretically knowledge,
- enhance independent work and research skills as a core competency
- strengthen collaborative teamwork abilities

#### sow972 Internship (12 CP)

- Prepares students for diverse professional opportunities
- Placement in various settings: companies, non-profits, public institutions (incl. universities / municipal institutions), associations, societies, governmental and non-governmental organizations, and other suitable organizations that can offer interns an activity related to the field of study / future professional activity.

The objectives are to provide students with ...

- exposure to non-academic environment
- language skills beyond academic studies
- experience in short-term, independent projects
- familiarity with new forms of cooperation communication and reporting techniques
- insights into different organizational contexts and processes.
- internship of 270 hours + accompanying course with internship report
- ✓ Completed consecutively or during the semester
