Before you arrive at Université Côte d'Azur, please make sure you have completed all the necessary registration formalities.

Budget

Preparing your budget is the first step before settling on the French Riviera. At a minimum, plan a monthly budget of 800 €.

To have additional income, you can do a student job. Please note, French law authorizes students international workers to work a maximum of 21 hours per week.

Official documents

Before leaving their home country, any foreign national wishing to study in France must obtain a long stay «Student» visa. You must apply to the French consular services in your country of residence. Nationals of the European Union, Andorra, Monaco, the Vatican, Switzerland, San Marino and Liechtenstein are exempt from the long-stay visa.

All the documents required for an application (birth certificate, academic documents) which are written in a foreign language, must be translated into French by a sworn translator approved by the French consular services in your home country.



Your passport must be valid for the duration of your study period in France.

Insurance

Before your departure, we advise you to take out health, travel and repatriation insurance. Other insurances will be necessary and mandatory to study in France: multi-risk home insurance (for rental contracts), civil liability (for academic registration and internships).



Some banks offer these services when you take out a bank card with them.

Once in France, after registering at the University, you will have access to French Social Security.

Banking

For day-to-day transactions (receiving a grant or salary, monthly bills, various payments) it is highly advisable to have a French bank account.

You will need the following documents to open a bank account:

- proof of identity
- proof of address
- proof of academic registration



Online banks can be an alternative to traditional banks.

Accommodation

There are several housing options on the French Riviera: university rooms, student residences, shared apartments, etc.

Registering at Université Côte d'Azur

The administrative registration is an online process, directly completed on the registration platform.

If you have technical problems registering, contact your school service:

http://glpi-form-sco.unice.fr/

The process is the same for the academic registration, which is completed afterwards.

Once the registration is completed, the **ENT account** (Digital Work Environment tool) has to be activated on the "Sésame" platform. This process will grant access to the enrolment certificate. All of the institutional information will be sent to this new account and email!



EXCHANGE STUDENTS

must also prepare their learning agreement.

If you are admitted as part of an exchange program, administrative registration is done when you arrive at the International Relations Office (SRI).

To finalize your registration, the payment for the CVEC (Contribution for Student and Campus Life) is mandatory (€103 for 2024-2025).

Erasmus+ students, refugees, asylum seekers and beneficiaries of subsidiary protection status are exempt from the CVEC fee.

Mobile subscription

You can take out a contract directly in store, contracts are often for a minimum of 12 to 24 months (before subscribing to anything, it is important to check if this matches with your stay length - you might have to pay a fee if you terminate your contract early).

Prepaid cards are rechargeable and can be bought in a supermarket or a Bar-Tabac.

Health System

The Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie (CPAM) is the French organization in charge of covering most medical fees. For the CEAM holders (European Health System Card), registering with the French health system (Sécurité Sociale) is not mandatory.

Overseas students have to register online.

This procedure is free and mandatory for students who:

- have a VLS-TS or VLS-T or C and D visa (Schengen);
- are Europeans and don't have the CEAM (European Health System Card);
- are Europeans with a S1 form;
- are not Europeans.
- · For a medical service, the CPAM refunds 70% of the total price, with **30%** left to pay.
- · All health professionals are listed on the website ameli.fr, and divided by categories (secteur 1: medical fees are fully refunded, secteur 2: additional fees can apply).



If you wish to pursue your studies when your study visa validity is coming to an end, you have to apply to the prefecture to renew it at least two months before it expires.

You can apply for a temporary student residence permit (valid I year) or multi-year student residence permit (valid 2-4 years), subject to financial resources. The procedure is as follows:

HOW TO GET TO CAMPUS

From Nice Côte d'Azur airport, the city's tramways provide access to several areas of the city. Tickets can be purchased at the ticket machines at each stop and also on the app Nice Ticket.

1,70€: single trip - 17€: 10 trip ticket

The Sophia Antipolis technology park can be reached with the **630** buses from Nice (Templiers stop for the SophiaTech campus). It is also possible to get there by bus from Antibes, Cannes and Grasse.

To get around the technopole, the university provides you with two electric bicycle stations located at the IUT and at the entrance to the Azur campus of the CNRS.

The Menton campuses are accessible by train from the Nice Ville train station (Tram stop «Gare Thiers»), or by bus (**n°110** from the airport, and **n°100** from downtown Nice).

The St Raphaël campus is also accessible by train from the Nice Ville train station (Tram stop «Gare Thiers»), or by bus **Zou83**, from the airport.

Nice's International Summer School

Every summer, UIEN welcomes all students wishing to acquire or improve their knowledge of French, with language training for Al, A2, B1, B2, C1 and C2 levels. Courses in English or Russian are also offered.

The UIEN also offers FLE (French as a foreign language) teachers wishing to revitalize their professional practices, a pedagogical course (SP).

Université Côte d'Azur summer school is open for 6 weeks from July to mid-August.

The courses take place from Monday to Friday, i.e. 20 hours per week for a total of 40 hours of courses per session (preferential rate for students pre-registered at Université Côte d'Azur).

Medical consultations and pharmacies

In France you must choose a GP (médecin traitant): the GP provides patients with routine care and preventive treatment and sends them to a specialist if need be. The GP is your first port of call if you are ill.

- A consultation with a GP costs between 23 and 28 €, part of which is reimbursed by student Social Security.
- A consultation with a specialist costs **between 25 and 90 €**, part of which can be reimbursed.

Generally, in France, you have to make an appointment to see a doctor. Usually, you have to wait a few days to have an appointment with a general practitioner, sometimes several months for a specialist. But some doctors consult without an appointment (you must check beforehand).

Some medicines can be purchased directly at the pharmacy and others are only available on prescription.

A prescription is given by a doctor, and most of the time you will be reimbursed for the drugs (not all drugs are reimbursed or not fully reimbursed).

Dos & Donts



Greetings: when you enter a shop/coffee/bus, always greet people with 'Bonjour' or 'Bonsoir' (after 6pm). Say 'au revoir' (goodbye) when leaving. Don't forget to use 's'il vous plait' (please) and 'merci' (thank you). This applies to administrative emails as well.

To greet someone, you can do 'la bise'.

When you are invited, **always bring something**: flowers, chocolate or wine are common gifts.

Compost your ticket each time you get on the tram or bus.

Respect your neighborhood from 10 p.m.

Collect dog droppings from your pet or you will be fined.

Sort your waste in the various containers provided for this purpose.



When speaking French, do not use « *tu* » but « *vous* » instead, until the person offers to switch. It is more formal and respectful.

Do not start your meal before everyone gets their food – in France, eating is a serious matter.

Being noisy when eating or drinking is considered rude.

Tips are not mandatory, but you can leave some change if you were satisfied with the service.

Don't be disappointed if social relationships take longer to develop than expected. The French will not invite you to their homes right away; building a network is a bit more difficult but it pays to be patient: good things take time!

It is forbidden to walk around the city topless.
