

Erasmus+ Experience Report

1. Preparation (Planning, Organisation, and Application to the Host Institution)

The transition process to study in Norway was very smooth. The host university was very reachable and supportive months before my departure. Their guidance on application procedures, learning agreements, and rules and regulations about the stay permit information was clear and timely. I had no worries regarding accommodation, as it was arranged in advance by the host university. I felt well-prepared and confident going into the exchange thanks to their proactive communication.
