Language proficiency and German courses

Some fields of study offer a wide range of courses in English, but at many departments the majority of courses is taught in German. We therefore recommend at least a B1/B2 level of German according to the Common European Framework of Reference for exchange students. To improve their language skills, exchange students can take German courses before or during the semester: **sprachenzentrum.univie.ac.at/en**

Exchange students receive special discounts for many of the courses.

Accommodation

The University of Vienna does not provide any student dorms, but exchange students can apply for rooms in halls of residence administrated by other institutions, or choose private housing.

Erasmus Student Network

The Erasmus Student Network (ESN) of the University of Vienna supports exchange students amongst other things by organising various social events. The ESN buddies help exchange students to find their way around in Vienna and provide a good opportunity for international students to get in touch with local students. esnuniwien.com

Arrival/Orientation

We recommend that exchange students arrive 1–2 weeks before the start of the semester. In September/February orientation sessions will be held during which students register at the university, receive their student ID card and get information regarding their stay at the University of Vienna.

Visa

Exchange students who do not have an EU/EEA or Swiss citizenship have to apply for a visa at the Austrian embassy or consulate in their home country as soon as possible. Depending on the duration of the stay, there are two options:

- up to 6 months: visa D
- longer than 6 months: residence permit

The catalogue can be searched by keyword(s) or browsed by various subjects/departments. Please note that not all courses are offered each semester. Course registration usually opens about a month before the semester starts and should be done online via each student's own university account. Examinations usually take place at the end of the semester.

Course options

Depending on the bilateral agreements with the respective home universities, different regulations apply to Erasmus and Non-EU Exchange students regarding course selection.

Mobility coordinators at the department

Exchange students have mobility coordinators at their department for all subject-specific queries. The relevant contact details will be sent to exchange students once they have been nominated.

Credits and Grades

The University of Vienna applies the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). One course typically has a value of 3 to 8 ECTS credit points depending on the type and workload of the course. The full semester course load amounts to 30 ECTS credits. Incoming students are expected to take at least 16 ECTS during their stay at the University of Vienna.
