EU-citizens and students coming from EFTA-members will need to hand in a copy of their European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). <u>www.unibas.ch/erasmus</u>
Visa	Once you have been accepted as an exchange student in Basel, you will have to prepare to enter and live in Switzerland as a foreigner. EU-citizens and students coming from EFTA-members do not need to apply for visa. They will have to register at the immigration office and get their residency permit once they are in Basel.
