Transcript of records (TOR)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The grading scale goes from 0 to 100; minimum grade required to pass being 60.• Students must attend at least 80% of classes in order to pass the course.• Grades are typically issued within 1-3 months after course completion.• The TORs will be sent to the international office of the home university once the academic cycle has ended.

Research stays / Internships	The acceptance for research and internships is subject to the approval of the corresponding University Center.
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F. Other information

Medical insurance requirements	Students must have comprehensive international health insurance coverage throughout their stay. The insurance policy must include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Medical and health coverage- Repatriation of remains- Coverage for accidents and diseases (excluding pre-existing conditions)- Medical assistance during recovery/convalescence- Psychological/mental health support The policy should be valid for the entire duration of your stay in the country.
Cost of the stay	The estimated cost of living is between 500 and 700 US dollars a month. Additional costs should be taken into consideration for unexpected occurrences.
Accommodation	There are no residences provided by the university; therefore, students will have to look for their own accommodation.
Buddy program	The University Center of Economic and Administrative Sciences (CUCEA) has a "Buddy program" to guide exchange students. The other campus, provide assistance through their Academic Exchange Unit.
Airport pick-up	Not available.
