DAYS 4,000 KILOMETRES

As a Murdoch Study Abroad and Exchange student, you will get to experience all that outback Australia has to offer with the Murdoch University North West trip.

Travelling by bus through the rugged Australian terrain, you will venture into the heart of the North West of Australia as you explore some of Western Australia's worldfamous destinations.

The Pilbara

The region you will be exploring while on the North West trip is known as the Pilbara. While rugged, hot and dusty, the Pilbara will mesmerise you with its beauty and breathtaking landscape. The mountainous outcrops that populate the region are some of the oldest in with world, dating back nearly two billion years and stretching over 500,000 kilometres. Home to more than 700 historic Indigenous archaeological sites and over 10,000 rock engravings, the Pilbara is synonymous with Australian history. While here, keep an eye out for the many species of native Australian flora and flora that call the Pilbara home, including rock wallabies, kangaroos and other species found only in Australia.

Karijini National Park

After experiencing the coast, the North West trip will take you to Western Australia's second largest national park, Karijini National Park. With over two billion years of the Earth's natural history laying in wait, Karijini has been largely untouched by humankind and offers a pristine and unique look into Western Australia's heartland. Remote in location, you will get to descend into ancient gorges, scale some of the oldest rocks on the planet, paddle in crystal-clear waterways and cool off with a swim beneath the various cascading waterfalls.

Shark Bay and Monkey Mia

A major highlight for many students who experience the North West trip is visiting one of the world's twelve Heritage listed regions, the Shark Bay World Heritage area. While here, you will have the opportunity to visit Monkey Mia. Famous for its wild dolphin experience, Monkey Mia is surrounded by rusty red sand dunes, white sandy beaches and water teeming with wildlife. With blue skies and sunshine almost every day of the year, Monkey Mia and Shark Bay are an ideal destination for you to sit back and relax. While here, you will get to meet the Monkey Mia dolphins, a group of five, wild Indo-Pacific Bottlenose dolphins that visit the shallows of Monkey Mia on a daily basis for supervised feedings by local rangers. Monkey Mia is also home to a range of other marine life, including dugongs, turtles, stingrays and sharks, all of which you can easily see swimming through the calm, crystal clear waters.

Ningaloo Reef

As part of the North West trip, you will have the opportunity to snorkel the world's largest fringing reef, and another World Heritage listed site, the Ningaloo Reef. More easily accessible than the Great Barrier Reef, and home to as many as 500 species of tropical fish and coral, the Ningaloo Reef spans 260 kilometres in length and runs alongside white sandy beaches and turquoise waters. Teaming with marine animals such as turtles, manta rays, dolphins and humpback whales, the Ningaloo Reef is also home to the migratory gentle giant, the whale shark

Fitted with the latest equipment, the three specialised laboratories, which include an exercise physiology lab, a performance lab and a rehabilitation, strength and conditioning lab, come complete with a climate and altitude chamber, motion capture systems, 50-metre running track and a fully-equipped gym with Olympic weightlifting facilities.

Veterinary hospital and working farms

Student Support team

The Student Support team is based in the Student Centre and looks after international students from their first day at Murdoch to their last. Students can come to Student Support with absolutely any issue they are having and the Student Support team will either help the student directly or refer them to someone who can better assist them, such as the school health services, which includes doctors, psychologists and counsellors, as well as visa or career advisors.

Equity and Social Inclusion Office

The Equity and Social Inclusion Office seeks to ensure the student experience at Murdoch University is free of discrimination and that all students are provided with an equal opportunity. The Equity and Social Inclusion Office coordinates a range of services for students including disability services, language and cultural exchange programs, equity complaints and information on your responsibilities and rights as a Murdoch student.

Support for Learning

The Support for Learning team brings together the areas of academic staff development, work-integrated learning, educational technologies, learning support and access programs.

Particular focus is placed on student learning. Support services are offered through workshops that focus on various learning skills, such as writing for academia, and learning programs such as postgraduate writing techniques, peer assisted study sessions (PASS), peer academic coaches (PAC) and UniEdge, which assists first year students with starting tertiary study.

Student Centre

The Student Centre is a friendly and efficient hub located at Murdoch's Perth campus, where you can find out a range of information about admissions, advanced standing, enrolments, examinations, fees, graduations, student support, Open Universities, parking and payments and general student administration enquiries.

Choosing your units

As a Study Abroad or Exchange student at Murdoch, you can choose from the hundreds of units on offer from across our eight of Study Areas. With the freedom to choose your own subjects, you can either elect to study units that complement your home degree, or take your study down an entirely new path by exploring a new subject area.

To study at Murdoch, you will need to enrol in at least 3 units (9 credit points) each semester. To enrol in certain units, you may need to meet particular entry requirements or have completed specified prerequisite study. To explore our full range of units and their entry requirements, visit **murdoch.edu.au/Units**

You should discuss what you intend to study at Murdoch with your home institution before you apply and check if there are any credit approval or transfer forms you need to complete.

To help you better understand how units may be transferred back to your home institution, please see the below credit conversion table. Please note that this table is only a recommendation of credit conversion and your university may choose to follow a different conversion or credit system.

The Australian Academic System

Due to the degree of specialisation in the Australian education system, it is a good idea for you to take first and second year level units during your time at Murdoch, even if you are a third year student.

Third year units are available to Study Abroad and Exchange students, however you must satisfy the prerequisite study requirements.

At Murdoch, there is a much greater emphasis placed on selfdirected study outside of the classroom. Most units involve on-campus lectures, with additional tutorials and laboratories. Additionally, students are expected to carry-out supplementary study with the assistance of Murdoch's online Learning Management System (LMS) and tutorial direction.

HOW TO APPLY



To start your application process for Study Abroad or Exchange at Murdoch, you will need to obtain approval from your home institution.

If you are studying at one of our official partner universities, and you have been nominated for a placement at Murdoch, you are known as an Exchange student. To find out if you qualify as an Exchange student, please speak to your home institution.

If you are applying to study at Murdoch directly, even if you are from one of our partner universities, you will be classified as a Study Abroad student. If you are a Study Abroad student, you can apply online at any time **murdoch.edu.au/MyAdmission**

You can also get help from Murdoch representatives within your home country. For a full list of Murdoch's Registered International Agents, visit **murdoch.edu.au/OverseasRepresentatives**



It is important to check that you meet the entry requirements for studying abroad at Murdoch. These may include, but are not limited to:

- If you are entering Murdoch directly from high school, you must meet our Minimum Entry Requirements;
- If you are currently enrolled in University, you must be in good academic standing at your home institution as per your academic records;
- You must be making sound academic progress at your home institution;
- You must meet our minimum English language requirements (if your first language is not English).



SUBMIT YOUR **C**

It is easy to apply for Study Abroad or Exchange at Murdoch, you may even be able to apply online.

If you are an Exchange student, you will receive application instructions after you have been nominated by your home university.

If you are a Study Abroad student, you will need to apply directly online **murdoch.edu.au/SAEApplication**

We know that applying to study abroad may seem a bit daunting, so that is why we have a dedicated team who will help you and manage your application every step of the way!



3 CHOOSE YOUR SUBJECTS

As a Study Abroad or Exchange student at Murdoch, you can choose units (subjects) from across our eight Study Areas. When selecting units, there are a few things to remember:

- Make sure you get the right start date for your units;
- Ensure you meet any unit prerequisites;
- Know your course codes this will assist you with your classsign up and application process;
- Select units at the right level of study.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

We recommend that you submit your application to study abroad at Murdoch as soon as possible. Our informal application deadlines are:

- 30 November to begin study in Semester 1 (February to June)
- 31 May to begin in Semester 2 (August to November)

If your application is received after these deadlines, you can still be considered on a case by case basis.

The Village

If you want to be in the centre of all the on-campus action, you cannot go past life at the Murdoch University Village.

Located at our Perth campus, your classes are right on your doorstep, with direct access to public transport and a range of local shops and on-campus amenities. The Village has stylish, fully furnished apartments available for rent, with options to suit almost any budget.

Rates

The rates for 2018 range from \$150.50 weekly for a twin-share bedroom to \$397.50 weekly for a one-bedroom apartment, per semester. If you book your accommodation for the entire university year (42 weeks), rather than just one semester at a time, the rates will be cheaper.
