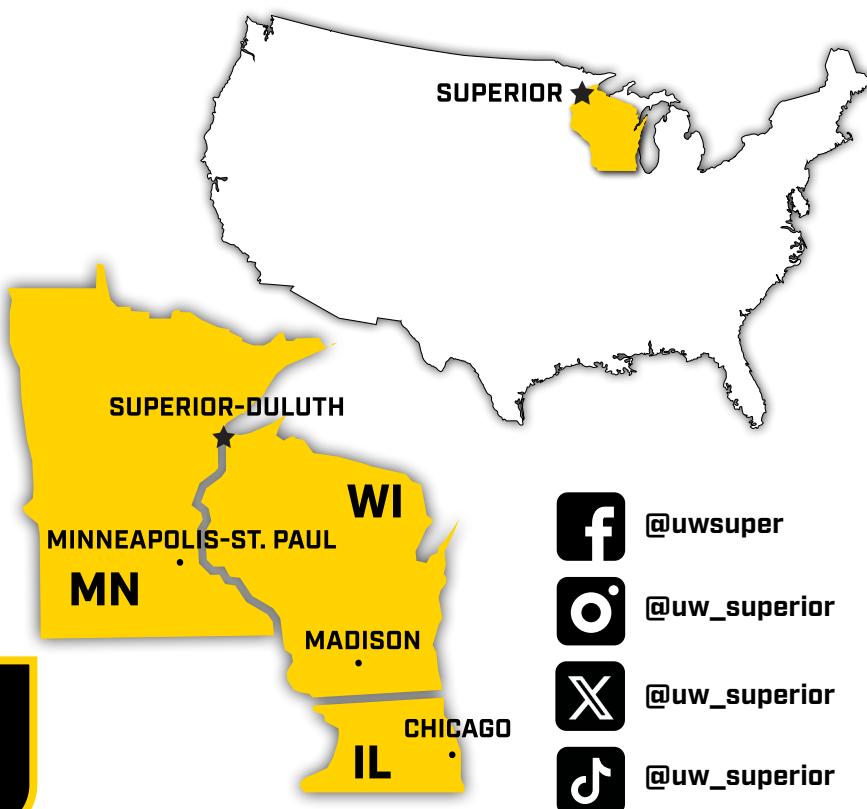

MAJOR

■ **CONCENTRATION** – a specific area of emphasis within a major or subfield, in which approximately half of a student's classes are directly related to the chosen area of concentration. This is indicated on the student's transcript.

🧪 **STEM Designated Degree Program** – For international students, this major is a STEM Designated Degree Program which can qualify you to extend your post-graduation stay in the United States.



Undergraduate Scholarships and Student Employment

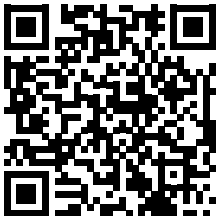
More than 90 percent of international students receive financial assistance/scholarships through the Nonresident Tuition Waiver (NTW) program. Degree-seeking international students who qualify for admission are automatically considered for NTW awards, which reduce tuition by \$5,800 - \$7,900 depending on academic achievement. NTW awards are renewable for four years.

Many international students work on campus. Continuing students are eligible to apply for more than 100 foundation scholarships after they have finished two semesters. How to Apply as an Undergraduate Student

Submit the following items to be considered for undergraduate admission and Nonresident Tuition Waiver (NTW). Clear scans are generally accepted.

- Application for admission (apply.wisconsin.edu)
- \$50 International Admission Processing Service Fee
- Official Transcripts
- Proof of English language proficiency (TOEFL: 61/IELTS: 5.5/ Duolingo 100)
- SAT or ACT optional
- Bank statement and Financial Verification Form
- Scan of passport

*Standard Admission indicates tuition and fees with no awarded scholarships. NTW Award requires a Freshman GPA of 2.90-3.39 or a Transfer GPA or 2.50-2.99. NTW Scholar Award requires a Freshman GPA of 3.4-4.0 or a Transfer GPA or 3.0-4.0. Required GPA is based on a 4.0 scale.

**Meal plan covers approximately 12 meals/week. Budget additional \$1,285/year for other meals. Some residence halls cost an additional amount (\$400+).

***Other expected expenses include required medical insurance (\$2,005) and books and supplies (\$1,050)
