Bicycle coding

Following the high demand last time, we are pleased to offer bicycle coding again as part of this year's City Cycling program.

On September 23, between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., you can have your bike marked by the ADFC. In the event of theft, the police or lost property office can then immediately identify you as the owner based on the code and contact you.
